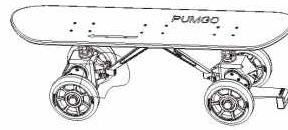

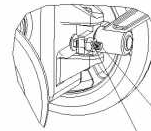

### Testing and Inspection

Use your hands to push the Pungo in the forward direction as the arrow shows on the deck to make sure it moves smoothly in the forward direction (see Fig.1)

### Riding Instructions and Safety Rule

1. Always wear proper protective gear when riding the Pungo. A helmet, elbow pads, wrist guards, and kneepads are a must.
2. Before riding always check that your Pungo's wheels and screws are tightly attached and make sure which end is the Pungo's forward direction. Failure to properly inspect your Pungo may result in serious injury.
3. Always ride on hard, smooth, and flat surfaces that do not have traffic. Keep away from dirt, sand, oils, gravel, and water. Skating on the wrong surface is not only dangerous, but will reduce the life span of your Pungo.
4. New users should use a railing or another person for support while getting the feel of the Pungo.
5. To ride: Place one foot over the front wheels and the other foot over the rear wheels. With short strokes, push down on the front of the board to build up momentum. Once you are rolling, you can start pushing down on the front and the back of the board. Try to keep your weight centered over the board.
6. To turn, shift your weight from the toe side or heel side of the board depending on which way you want to turn.
7. To brake: shift your body weight to the rear end of the deck to lift the front wheels and press the brake pad on the ground.
8. Do not skate down steep inclines and keep all wheels on the ground at all times except when braking. Never let anybody tow you while skating. Doing so could result in severe injury or death.

9. Please read and understand these instructions before you ride your Pungo. Kids under 18 should ride with adult supervision at all times. Riding the Pungo can be a lot of fun, but it can also be very dangerous. Serious injury or death may occur if you do not use the utmost care, caution, and common sense at all times. Use of the Pungo is at your own risk and the seller of this Pungo assumes no responsibility for injury/damage that may be caused by the use of the Pungo. ### PUMGO Steering Adjustment:

Use a small adjustable crescent wrench



The PUMGO features a unique adjustable steering system which allows the rider to customize the tightness of the steering. Generally, lighter riders will want the steering to be looser than heavier riders. Looser steering will allow for a tighter turning radius but may also make the board feel less stable, especially at higher speeds.

To adjust the steering (see Fig.2)

- 1) Flip the board upside-down so the deck is on the ground
- 2) Locate the **steering adjustment screws** and **nuts** on each side of where the A-frame center strut attaches to the gearbox.
- 3) To adjust the steering you must first loosen the **nut** that locks the steering bolt

- in place.
- 4) After loosening the nut, you can adjust the steering by turning the **steering adjustment screw**.
  - 5) To loosen the steering, turn the **black steering screw** so that the head does not make contact with the black rubber bushing on the gearbox. The greater the space between the screw and the bushing, the looser the steering will be.
  - 6) To tighten the steering, turn the screw so that it presses up against the bushing.
  - 7) Once you have all 4 steering screws adjusted evenly, re-tighten the steering nut to lock the steering screw into place.
  - 8) To maintain even turning toward the left and right, make sure that all 4 screws are adjusted evenly.

### Riding the PUMGO is as easy as 1..2..3

Before riding, find a flat smooth surface to ride on free of cars or traffic. The arrow on the deck points toward the front of the board and the direction that the PUMGO will go.

#### Step 1.

Place your front foot on the board over the front axle

#### Step 2.

Place your back foot on the board over the rear axle (not on the tip of the board until you are used to riding).

#### Step 3.

Keep your weight centered over the board and make short thrusts down with your front foot to get the PUMGO rolling



Once you are rolling, you can pump both ends of the board evenly to pick up more speed. The faster you pump the board, the faster you'll go!!
